Canstruction® Madison DeCanstruction Plan

Volunteers will tear down Canstruction® structures. Canstruction® Teams will submit a DeCanstruction Plan to MOM

The DeCanstruction Plan will identify:

1. Information about the Structure that will help volunteers take it down.
2. Information about the Structure that might constitute a risk to the volunteers as they tear it down.
3. Structure materials that Teams would like saved. Items not identified to be saved in the DeCanstruction Plan will be discarded. **NOTE: Teams must retrieve these materials by 10:00 am on Monday, April 30, 2018**
4. Team members that will help volunteers with the deconstruction.

Example of DeCanstruction Plan

1st National Bank (team name)

“Banking on Food Banks” (structure name)

1. The structure is composed of canned goods and food stuffs that are wrapped in clear plastic packages. Most of the canned goods are free standing, but there are some canned goods that have been secured by clear tape. The layers of canned goods are separated by either thin plywood (near the bottom) or foam board (near the top). There is motor near the top of the structure that drives a wind mill. The motor is driven by a dry cell battery that is located under a tarp behind the structure.
2. Disconnect the battery and set aside before tear down. Several of the plywood sheets were reinforced with thin strips of wood which were attached with nails. Be careful of nails that could loosen during tear down.
3. The team wishes to save the battery, connecting wires, the motor, the tarp, plywood and foam board.
4. The following team members will help with the tear down: John Banker, Sally Loaner and Mary Teller.
